Dear parent,

As we near the end of the school year your child will be taking part in a number of important events. Attendance must remain high throughout this week and next week as we have planned all the work that pupils will do carefully to ensure we consolidate their learning and they are going into next year in the strongest possible position.

Curriculum Days - This week we have two curriculum days in which pupils will take part in trips or in-school workshops linked to the curriculum. These include university visits for Y7 / 8 and GCSE taster day for Y9 pupils. Y9 pupils will receive their summer reading in preparation for their GCSE courses in September on this day.

Next week pupils will have lessons as usual, including feedback lessons from their End of Year Exams. They will also be preparing for the ARD meeting with you. During the End of Year Graduation, pupils will find out which subjects they have moved up a band in. Pupils that move up a band in any subject have made more than nationally expected progress and have therefore greatly increased their chance of getting a higher final GCSE grade.

ARD meetings (19th and 20th July) – you will meet with your child’s tutor to discuss their overall progress this year. We will share their report and results for their End of Year Exams as well as discussing their bands for next year. Attendance at these meetings is compulsory as they are vital in ensuring we can work together to support your child to reach their full potential.
