

## Primary PE and Sport Premium

### Review of 2016-17 and plan for 2017-18

#### What is the Primary PE and Sport Premium?

The Government provides funding of £150 million per annum to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. The funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.
