Nursery topic: People who help us

Key texts/Stories: George's dragon at the fire station, Fire engine is flashing, Going to the doctor, Officer George and keeping safe.

Knowledge and Understanding of the World: Becoming familiar with the roles of people in the community that help us, focusing on Doctors, Nurses, firefighters, and Police officers.

Technology: Becoming familiar with the technology Beebots, being able to familiarise themselves and being able to control them through positional language.

Expressive arts and design: Creating own fire engine, police cars and ambulance through junk modelling and using different materials.



Reception topic: Into the Woods

Key texts/stories: Little Red Riding Hood, The Three Little Pigs, Goldilocks and the Three bears, We're Going on a Bear Hunt

Maths: Numbers 11-20, 1 more/less than, measuring length and weight, shapes and sorting, repeated patterns

Knowledge and Understanding of the World: Seasonal changes - Spring, Easter, stranger danger, wood and forest animals, visit to Walthamstow Wetlands Centre, animals and their habitats, building bug hotels, den building, looking at different homes around the world.

Technology: Using simple computer programmes for embedding maths skills, taking photos and videos to record role-play and den building

Expressive arts and design: Den building, designing and creating homes using recycled materials, cooking (pancakes and porridge), using varied materials such as straw, sticks and bricks to construct, designing Easter cards and eggs (exploring repeated patterns).
