Y13 Results day

This year, results day for pupils in year 13 will take place on Tuesday 10th of August. We are enormously proud of the effort and tenacity that our pupils have demonstrated throughout the course of KS5 and are very much looking forward to celebrating their achievements with them.

On results day we want to ensure your child has the correct level of 1:1 guidance to support them on this important day. We know you will be responsible and attend in a face mask and we will control the flow of pupils into the building to ensure it is a safe and organised area for you to receive your results and talk through any questions you have. There will be two specific blocks of time for pupils to attend school.

8.30 am - 10 am	<ol style="list-style-type: none">Pupils who have not met the offer for their firm or insurance choice. You will know this by logging onto UCAS Track, which all students should do at 8.30am. We will call to confirm you need to come into school at 8.30am if this applies to you. We will provide you with expert guidance and support to go through clearing to ensure you end up at a great destination and course you feel excited to begin.Pupils for whom we need to clarify post-18 plans. Ms Nohavicka will contact you and your parents separately if this applies to you.Pupils who may be eligible for Cambridge Adjustment. This applies to anyone who was rejected from Cambridge but told they were eligible for Adjustment.
10 am - 12pm	Pupils who have met the offer for their Firm or their Insurance choice, or who did not make a UCAS application. You may come at any point during this period.

Attached to this letter is a student guide to results day which has all of the information that students might need to support them. All students should read this information carefully and do the preparation activities to ensure that they are well prepared for the day. In addition, Ms Nohavicka will run a short briefing at **3pm on the 20th July via the Year 13 Teams Channel** to outline the key information for the day.

The school has undertaken an enormous amount of work to ensure the validity of all centre assessed grades. This includes internal and network level standardisation and moderation; data meetings with every head of department and extensive external checks by the exam board that we have been partnered with. As a result of this process, it is very unlikely that the school has made a mistake when issuing your grade. If you do think that an error has occurred, you are entitled to request a centre review.
